The holiday season is almost here, and we're excited to help promote your upcoming events!



The Callithumpian parade began in the early 1900's, but the first official parade held in 1925. The Decatur Chamber of Commerce started sponsoring the parades in 1936 and the parade has grown tremendously since the 70's. The Callithumpian parade has become a fixture in downtown Decatur, an event the community looks forward to each October in celebration of Halloween. On the evening of the parade you can find most of Decatur's citizens camped along the parade route waiting for the floats, bands and of course, candy!

The committee may be the organizing body of the Callithumpian Festival, but the heart of Callithumpian is the business community, industries, service clubs, sororities, churches and individuals who, each year, generously support this festival with donations of both money and time to continue the tradition!

In October the downtown will host numerous events for Callithumpian Week including the annual parade that is scheduled for October 27.

November brings the kickoff for the holiday season with the Main Street sponsored Decatur Christmas Open House, November 21-22 and the Community Christmas Tree Lightning on Friday evening, November 21. Whether you go all-out gory, creepy-cute, or anything in between, costumes are highly encouraged.


